



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/37

Copy paper

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to report to the Parliamentary Secretary

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 10 October 2013, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of copy paper exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2013/79. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 28 January 2014. In response to my request, the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (Parliamentary Secretary) approved, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, an extension of time to publish the SEF to on or before 14 March 2014. The due date for my report to the Minister was extended to 28 April 2014.

After receiving submissions from interested parties in response to the SEF, I consider that there are some matters that warrant further investigation. The Parliamentary Secretary has approved an extension of time of 60 days for me to provide my report and recommendations to him. My report to the Parliamentary Secretary is now due by 27 June 2014.
