ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2016/73

CLEAR FLOAT GLASS

Exported from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia and the Kingdom of Thailand

Extension of time granted to report to the Parliamentary Secretary

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 22 February 2016, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, published a notice announcing the initiation of an inquiry into whether the continuation of anti-dumping measures in respect of clear float glass exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia) and the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand) is justified.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2016/19. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

On 28 June 2016, I published a statement of essential facts (SEF) in relation to this inquiry. The SEF sets out the facts on which I propose to base my recommendations to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).¹ Interested parties had until 18 July 2016 to make submissions in response to the SEF.

Due to the complexity of the issues surrounding the inquiry and the timing of the publication of the SEF, I considered that further time would be required for me to consider any submissions received in relation to the SEF. For this reason, I requested an extension of time, under subsection 269ZH(1)(g) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), to the deadline to provide the Parliamentary Secretary with my final report and recommendations.

¹ The Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science has delegated responsibility with respect to anti-dumping matters to the Parliamentary Secretary, and accordingly, the Parliamentary Secretary is the relevant decision maker. On 19 July 2016, the Prime Minister appointed the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science as the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science.

The then Assistant Minister for Science and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science has, under subsection 269ZH(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for me to provide the final report. My final report will now be provided to the Parliamentary Secretary by no later than 12 August 2016.

The Parliamentary Secretary must make a declaration within 30 days after receiving the final report, or due to special circumstances, such longer period as the Parliamentary Secretary considers appropriate.
