



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/02

Rod in coils

Exported from the Republic of Indonesia, Taiwan and the Republic of Turkey

Further extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 10 April 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of rod in coils exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia), Taiwan and the Republic of Turkey (Turkey).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/27. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 29 July 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Minister) in relation to the application for anti-dumping measures.

On 29 July 2014, the Commission advised that the then Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (Parliamentary Secretary) had, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF to 17 October 2014 (see ADN 2014/64).

A further extension that revised the deadline to 15 January 2015 was approved by the Parliamentary Secretary. Notification of this decision was made by the Commission on 17 October 2014 (see ADN 2014/97).

To enable the Commission's completion of its offsite verification of exporter information from Turkey and Indonesia, I have requested a further extension of time to the publication of the SEF.

The Minister has, under section 269ZHI of the Act, further extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 1 March 2015. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before 15 April 2015.
