

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/37**

## Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel Exported from India and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

## Further extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

## Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 11 July 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from India and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/55. This ADN is available on the Commission's website at <a href="https://www.adcommission.gov.au">www.adcommission.gov.au</a>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 29 October 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary). On 22 October 2014, the then Parliamentary Secretary approved an extension to the deadline to publish the SEF to 18 March 2015 (ADN No. 2014/117 refers).

Due to the continuing heavy workload of the Commission, which has contributed to an extended delay in completing exporter visits, I requested a further extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF under paragraph 269ZHI(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act). The Parliamentary Secretary has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act, further extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **17 May 2015**.

Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 1 July 2015.
