



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2016/126

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Extension of Time Granted to Issue the Statement of Essential Facts and Submit the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 16 August 2016, I Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2016/77, available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 5 December 2016. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).¹

The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary would be made in a final report on or before 18 January 2017, unless I terminate the investigation.

I requested an extension of time under subsections 269ZHI(1)(a) and 269ZHI(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to the deadline for the publication of the SEF and submission of the final report to the Parliamentary Secretary to allow further verification activities to be completed.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF and submission of the final report. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 2 February 2017. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a final report due on or before 20 March 2017, unless the

investigation is terminated.²
