**INVESTIGATION INTO THE ALLEGED DUMPING OF  
ZINC COATED (GALVANISED) STEEL EXPORTED TO AUSTRALIA  
FROM INDIA AND THE SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM**

Thank you for your submission dated 6 January 2015.

The Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) has decided that it will not be re-considering its determination that Indian Steel Corporation Ltd (Indian Steel) is an 'uncooperative exporter' as defined in subsection 269T(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

The Commission is of the view that there has not been any failure to provide Indian Steel with an adequate opportunity to address the information requirements of the Commission.

A number of exporters from India were provided with extensions of time to submit responses to the Exporter Questionnaire. All were on the condition that a complete and accurate response was required by the extended deadline, failing which the exporter may be deemed 'uncooperative'. The Commission notes that other exporters have complied with that condition.

Indian Steel was required to provide a complete and accurate response to the questionnaire by the extended deadline of 3 September 2014, which is 54 days from initiation of the investigation. The Commission considers that the timeframes for compliance were reasonable.

The Commission will have regard to all relevant information available in determining export price and normal value for Indian Steel, in accordance with subsections 269TAC(3) and 269TAC(6) of the Act respectively.
