INVESTIGATION INTO ALLEGED DUMPING OF

CERTAIN CRYSTALLINE SILICONPHOTOVOLTAIC MODULES OR PANELS EXPORTED FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

NOTE FOR FILE- SIMAX (SUZHOU) GREEN NEW ENERGY CO., LTD. - EXTENSION TO EXPORTER QUESTIONNAIRE

Background

On 29 May 2014, Simax (Suzhou) Green New Energy Co., Ltd. (Simax) requested, and the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission), provided an exporter questionnaire regarding certain crystalline silicon photovoltaic modules or panels (PV modules or panels). Simax is seeking its own individual dumping margin rates. The response to the exporter questionnaire was due by 20 June 2014.

On 18 June 2014, a consultant representing Simax wrote to the Commission seeking an extension until 27 June 2014.

The reasons for the extension are as follows:

- the sales manager and his relevant staff who are responsible for the export sales to Australia are abroad from June 1 to 15 on a business trip.
- their absence severely affect the preparation of export sales data, as other division's sales staff do not have full access to the Australian export sales documents.

Decision

After carefully considering Simax's request and taking into account the strict legislative timeframes, the Commission granted Simax an extension of one week. The Commission expects the questionnaire response to be complete in all respects in the first instance including filing in the public record version of the questionnaire by this date.

The responses to the exporter questionnaire from Simax are now due by 27 June 2014.
