



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2016/112

Steel Shelving Units

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to publish the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 4 July 2016, I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission), published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of steel shelving units exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No.2016/65. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 22 October 2016. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary).¹

Ambiguities in the goods description have contributed to delays in the provision of information from interested parties. These delays have impacted the ability of the Commission to verify relevant data. Accordingly, I requested a longer period of time to publish the SEF.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*, extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than 9 January 2017. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. As a result of the extension to the SEF, the recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 23 February 2017.

¹ On 19 July 2016, the Prime Minister appointed the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science as the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science. For the purposes of this investigation the Minister is the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science.
