



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/54

Certain Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from People's Republic of China

Further extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 12 June 2014, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures in respect of certain aluminium extrusions (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/46. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that a statement of essential facts (SEF) for the review would be placed on the public record by 1 October 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base my recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Parliamentary Secretary) in relation to the review. On 22 September 2014, the Parliamentary Secretary approved an extension to the deadline to publish the SEF on 30 December 2014 (ADN 2014/104 refers). On 15 December 2014, the Parliamentary Secretary approved a second extension to the deadline to publish the SEF on 29 April 2015 (ADN 2014/138 refers).

I requested a further extension of the deadline under subsection 269ZHI(1)(d) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) for the publication of the SEF to complete the analysis of all relevant information currently before the Commission.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the Act, extended the deadline for publication of the SEF. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **29 May 2015**. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will be made in a report due on or before 13 July 2015.
