Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

**Grinding balls exported to Australia
from the People's Republic of China**

Notice pursuant to subsection 10(3B) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science,¹ having decided to issue a notice pursuant to subsection 269 TJ(1) and subsection 269 TJ(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Customs Act) in respect of grinding balls described in that notice (the goods), DIRECT, pursuant to subsection 10(3B) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act), that the interim countervailing duty referred to in subsection 10(3A) of the Dumping Duty Act in respect of grinding balls exported from the People's Republic of China to Australia be ascertained as a proportion of the export price of those particular goods.

Pursuant to subsection 10(3DA) of the Dumping Duty Act, I have not had regard to the desirability of fixing a lesser rate of interim countervailing duty under subsection 10(3D) of the Dumping Duty Act because I am satisfied that in relation to the goods the subject of the notice under subsections 269 TJ(1) and 269 TJ(2) of the Customs Act:

- the normal value of the goods was not ascertained under subsection 269 TAC(1) of the Customs Act because of the operation of subsection 269 TAC(2)(a)(ii) of the Customs Act (subsection 10(3DA)(c) of the Dumping Duty Act).

In accordance with subsections 45(2), 45(3A)(b) and 269 TN(2) of the Customs Act, this notice applies to the goods and like goods entered for home consumption on and after 22 April 2016.
