

## Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel and Aluminium Zinc Coated Steel Exported from the People's Republic of China

Termination of part of investigations

Public notice under subsection 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 26 November 2012 the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service (ACBPS) initiated investigations following separate applications lodged by BlueScope Steel Limited, a manufacturer of zinc coated (galvanised) steel and aluminium zinc coated steel ("the goods") in Australia. The applications seek the publication of countervailing duty notices in respect of galvanised steel and aluminium zinc coated steel exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China).

Customs and Border Protection published a notice in *The Australian* on 26 November 2012 notifying of the initiation of the investigations, and issued Australian Customs Dumping Notice (ACDN) 2012/56, which contains further details on the investigations, available at <a href="http://www.customs.gov.au/anti-dumping/notices.asp">http://www.customs.gov.au/anti-dumping/notices.asp</a>.

As a result of ACBPS's investigations, the Delegate of the CEO of ACBPS is satisfied that in relation to galvanised steel:

 exported by Angang Steel Company Limited (ANSTEEL) and ANSC TKS Galvanising Co., Ltd (TAGAL), countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of the goods, but the subsidy margin is not more than two per cent and, therefore, the Delegate has decided to terminate the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(2) of the Customs Act 1901 (the Act) so far as it relates to those exporters

The Delegate of the CEO of ACBPS is also satisfied that in relation to aluminium zinc coated steel:

 exported by ANSTEEL, countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of the goods, but the subsidy margin is not more than two per cent and, therefore, the Delegate has decided to terminate the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(2) of the Act so far as it relates to ANSTEEL.

In making the decisions to terminate, the Delegate of the CEO has had regard to the applications, submissions from interested parties, Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) no. 193, submissions in response to that SEF, and other relevant information.

Termination Report no. 193(i), which sets out reasons for the termination decisions, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decisions are based, has been placed on ACBPS's public record, available at <a href="http://www.customs.gov.au/anti-dumping/cases.asp">http://www.customs.gov.au/anti-dumping/cases.asp</a>. Alternatively, the public record may be examined at Customs House by contacting the case manager on the details provided below.

The investigations into the alleged countervallable subsidisation of galvanised steel and aluminium zinc coated steel from China will continue. ACBPS is due to report to the Attorney General<sup>1</sup> in respect of these investigations on or by 29 June 2013.

The applicant may request a review of the Delegate's decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Penal in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
