

Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

CERTAIN ALUMINIUM EXTRUSIONS EXPORTED THROUGH ONE OR MORE THIRD COUNTRIES FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

Notice pursuant to subsection 10(3B) of the Customs Tariff (Anti- Dumping) Act 1975

I, KAREN ANDREWS, the Minister for Industry, Science, and Technology (the Minister), having decided to issue a notice pursuant to subsection 269ZDBH(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect certain aluminium extrusions described in that notice (the goods), DIRECT, pursuant to subsection 10(3B)(a) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act), that the interim countervailing duty referred to in subsection 10(3A) of that Act in respect of certain aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from China be ascertained as a proportion of the export price of those particular goods for:

- Malaysia by Zinaco Industrial and Hardware Industries Ltd
- Taiwan by Yun Sin Enterprise Co., Ltd; and
- Thailand by Bay Enterprise Co., Ltd, Siam Industrial Supplies Ltd and V-Power Biotech Limited Partnership.

Pursuant to subsection 10(3DA) of the Dumping Duty Act, I have not had regard under subsection 10(3D) of the Dumping Duty Act, to the desirability of fixing the amount of interim countervailing duty in respect of the goods that does not exceed the non-injurious price as last ascertained because I am satisfied that the normal value of the goods was not ascertained under subsection 269TAC(1) of the Act because of the operation of subsection 269TAC(2)(a)(ii) of the Act in respect of goods exported from the People's Republic of China.

This notice applies to the goods and like goods entered for home consumption on and after the day this notice is published.
