Extension of time granted to issue the Final Report

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 19 January 2015, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of prepared or preserved tomatoes exported to Australia from Italy by Feger di Gerardo Ferraioli S.p.A. and La Doria S.p.A.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2015/05. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 9 May 2015 and a recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science (Parliamentary Secretary) would be made on or before 23 June 2015.

On 1 May 2015, ADN No. 2015/56 notified an extension of time granted to issue the SEF to 7 August 2015. On 7 August 2015, ADN No. 2015/97 notified an extension of time granted to issue the SEF to 4 September 2015.

As a result of the extension granted on 7 August 2015, a recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary was to be made in a report due on or before 19 October 2015.

The SEF and Preliminary Affirmative Determination published on 4 September 2015 has elicited a number of extensive and detailed submissions that raise complex issues regarding the appropriate construction of normal values and the scope of injury claims. So as to allow time to properly consider these matters, I requested an extension of 90 days to the deadline for a recommendation to be made to the Parliamentary Secretary under subsection 269ZHI(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

The Parliamentary Secretary on 16 October 2015, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the deadline for a recommendation to be made. The recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made no later than 17 January 2016.
