

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/60**

## Quenched and Tempered Steel Plate Exported from Finland, Japan and Sweden Further extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

## Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

On 8 January 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of Quenched and Tempered steel plate exported from Finland, Japan and Sweden.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/01. This ADN is available on the internet at www.adcommission.gov.au

The initiation notice advised that the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the public record by 28 April 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commission proposes to base its recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary).

On 16 April 2014, the Parliamentary Secretary approved an extension to the deadline in which to publish the SEF to 28 Jul 2014, as detailed in ADN 2014/36.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, further extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF by 30 days. The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **27 August 2014**.

The further extension has been granted to provide an opportunity for interested parties to review and make submissions in respect of key materials that have recently been, or are about to be, placed on the public record. These materials include verification visit reports containing preliminary views of the Commission on relevant issues. Interested parties are encouraged to provide any submissions in relation to these materials at the earliest opportunity, noting that the Commissioner is not obliged to have regard to submissions if to do so would, in the Commissioner's opinion, prevent the timely placement of the SEF on the public record.

Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record. A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 13 October 2014.
