RESUMED INVESTIGATION - CFG FROM CHINA, INDONESIA AND THAILAND

This submission, made on behalf of PT Asahimas Flat Glass Tbk ("AMG") and AGC Flat Glass Asia Pacific Pte Ltd ("AFAP"), is in response to the TMRO's decision to revoke Customs' decision to terminate the investigation concerning clear float glass ("CFG") from China, Indonesia and Thailand

Fundamental to the TMRO's revocation of the said termination decision was his concern over the ability for CSR Viridian ("Viridian") to make representations on Customs finding that negligible injury was caused by dumping. This resumed investigation provides opportunity for Viridian to make these representations. We await access to these representations, which we trust will be made by 1 July 2011, so that we may provide our comments on them

In the meantime, we reiterate our view that when the injurious effects of factors other than dumped imports which were at the same time injuring Viridian during the injury analysis period are separated and distinguished, as is necessary according to WTO jurisprudence, the injury experienced by Viridian by reason of dumped imports of themselves is not material. Our submissions of 23 and 28 September 2010 and 14 October 2010 to the original investigation provide rationale for this view.
