

ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/101

Certain deep drawn stainless steel sinks

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 18 March 2014, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of certain deep drawn stainless steel sinks exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/20. This ADN is available on the internet at <u>www.adcommission.gov.au</u>.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation would be placed on the Public Record by 7 July 2014. The SEF will set out the facts on which I propose to base recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry (the Parliamentary Secretary). On 7 July 2014, the Parliamentary Secretary approved an extension to the deadline to publish the SEF to 5 October 2014 (or the next working day) (ADN 2014/50 refers).

Due to the complexity of the issues surrounding the investigation, I requested an additional extension of the deadline for the publication of the SEF.

The Parliamentary Secretary has, under section 269ZHI of the *Customs Act 1901*, further extended the deadline for the publication of the SEF. It will now be placed on the Public Record no later than 5 January 2015. Interested parties will be invited to make submissions to the Commission in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the Public Record.

A recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary will now be made in a report due on or before 19 February 2015.
