Discussed:

- Staughton's is an authorised representative for JFE Steel Corporation (JFE), Total Steel of Australia and Vulcan Steel Pty Ltd.
- Staughton's requested a brief meeting with the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) to outline its client's views on injury causation factors in regards to the investigation into the alleged dumping of Quenched and Tempered steel plate (Q&T steel plate) exported from Finland, Japan and Sweden.
- Staughton's and its clients discussed their views in regards to:
 - o the Australian industry's production volumes;
 - o the Australian industry's production processes/cycle times;
 - o the Australian industry's product limitations (including potential exemptions);
 - the Australian market for Q&T steel plate;
 - o changes in consumption/demand in Australia;
 - o other potential causes of injury;
 - JFE Q&T steel plate entering a different market to Australian industry Q&T steel plate; and
 - o the applicable tariff subheadings.
