Quicklime exported from Thailand Comments of Chememan Co. Ltd regarding SEF 179B

As you know, we act for Chememan Co. Ltd ("Chememan") in this matter.

Chememan has reviewed the findings made by the Anti-Dumping Commission ("the Commission") in Statement of Essential Facts 179B ("the SEF"). Chememan is pleased that the SEF has adopted many of the positions that Chememan has advocated throughout the span of this investigation. Of particular importance, Chememan notes that the SEF makes the following findings:

- that, once set, the period of investigation cannot be amended;
- that any injury that may have occurred prior to the investigation period cannot be attributed to dumping; and
- that any injury that was found to be attributable to dumping during the period of investigation was negligible.

Chememan supports these findings of the SEF.

On the basis of the finding that any injury suffered by the Australian industry as a result of dumping was negligible, Chememan respectfully requests that the Anti-Dumping Commissioner terminate this investigation under Section 269TDA(13) of the *Customs Act 1901* at the soonest possible opportunity.
