PRELIMINARY AFFIRMATIVE DETERMINATION AND IMPOSITION OF SECURITIES

Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel

**Exported to Australia from the Republic of India, Malaysia
and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam**

Section 269TD of the Customs Act 1901

I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, after having regard to:

- (i) an application made under section 269TB of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) by BlueScope Steel Limited, representing the Australian industry producing like goods, in respect of the alleged dumping and subsidisation of zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from the Republic of India (India) and from the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (Vietnam) and alleged dumping of galvanised steel exported to Australia from Malaysia;
- (ii) submissions received after the date of initiation of the investigation concerning the publication of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice; and
- (iii) information obtained during the course of verification visits to the Australian industry, exporters, importers and end-users

make a preliminary affirmative determination that there appears to be sufficient grounds for the publication of:

- a dumping duty notice in relation to galvanised steel exported to Australia from India, Malaysia and Vietnam; and
- a countervailing duty notice in relation to galvanised steel exported to Australia from India.

Furthermore, I am satisfied under subsection 269TD(4)(b) of the Act that it is necessary for the Commonwealth to require and take securities under section 42 of the Act, in respect of any interim dumping duty and any interim countervailing duty that may become payable in respect of the goods imported from India, Malaysia and Vietnam and entered for home consumption in Australia on or after **1 June 2017**.
