



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/16

Deep drawn stainless steel sinks

Exported from People's Republic of China

Termination of part of investigation

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 18 March 2014, I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of deep drawn stainless steel sinks exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), following an application lodged by Tasman Sinkware Pty Ltd (the applicant).

The Anti-Dumping Commission (Commission) published a notice in *The Australian* on 18 March 2014 notifying of the initiation of the investigation, and issued Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2014/20, which contains further details on the investigation, available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

As a result of the subsidisation investigation:

- I am satisfied that, in relation to Zhongshan Jiabaolu Kitchen and Bathroom Products Co., Ltd (Jiabaolu) and Primy Corporation Limited (Primy), countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of some or all of the goods, but during the investigation period, this never exceeded the negligible level of countervailable subsidy under subsection 269TDA(16) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act); and
- therefore, have decided to terminate the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(2)(b)(ii) of the Act so far as it relates to those exporters.

In making the decision to terminate, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, Statement of Essential Facts no. 238, submissions in response to that statement, and other relevant information.

Termination Report no. 238, which sets out reasons for the termination decision, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decision based, has been placed on the Commission's public record, which may be examined at the Commission office by contacting the case manager on the details provided below. Alternatively, the public record is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

A notice of my decision to terminate was published in *The Australian* newspaper on 19 February 2015.

PUBLIC RECORD

The Commission provided its report to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science in respect of the dumping investigation, and the countervailing investigation (for all exporters but Primy and Jiabaolu) on 19 February 2015. The Minister's decision on this report is due by 21 March 2015, unless extended.

The applicant may request a review of this decision to terminate part of the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of the public notice.
