PV SOLAR MODULES OR PANELS FROM CHINA


Anti-Dumping Notice (“ADN”) No. 2015/63 of 19 May 2015 advises that the Parliamentary Secretary has granted an extension of the captioned investigation for 60 days for the Commission to investigate Tindo Solar’s new allegations that the Government of China (“GOC”) has influenced the costs and prices of PV solar modules or panels in the Chinese domestic market. ADN 2015/63 also advises that *interested parties will be advised of the progress and outcome of this new avenue of inquiry as required.*

If the Commission’s extended investigation finds that the GOC has influenced costs/prices of PV solar modules in the Chinese domestic market and the Commissioner proposes to make a recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary rather than to propose termination of the investigation as notified in Statement of Essential Facts (“SEF”) No. 239, it will be necessary for the Commission to publish a revised SEF providing the facts upon which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary in accordance with s269TDAA(1) of the Customs Act (“the Act”).

It then follows that interested parties will have 20 days to make submissions in response to the revised SEF to enable the Commissioner to decide on the recommendations to be made to the Parliamentary Secretary in accordance with s269TEA(3) of the Act.

We request your early advice of the Commission’s intended process and timeframes therefor if it reaches a finding of the GOC having influenced costs/prices of PV solar modules or panels in the Chinese domestic market and the Commissioner therefore proposes to make recommendations to the Parliamentary Secretary.
