**MEETING WITH TBEA, 5 AUGUST 2014**

TBEA sought a meeting with the Commission to discuss the position of the Commission on whether the exports by TBEA are within the investigation period (and whether TBEA is entitled to an individual dumping margin) or, if not, whether TBEA would be entitled to apply for accelerated review.

The purpose of the meeting was to provide further clarification on Commission's current position provided in Issues Paper 2014/01 regarding Identification of which export shipments are used for dumping margin calculations.

TBEA explained a number of issues and concerns that have been previously provided to the Commission in public submissions.

During the meeting, the Commission provided TBEA with:

- general information regarding the Commission procedures dealing with submissions;
- clarification of the Commission's position regarding the date of export as described in Issues Paper 2014/01;
- general information on possible outcomes which will be presented in the Statement of Essential Facts on 8 September 2014 and, if anti-dumping measures were imposed by the Minister, options available to TBEA regarding duty assessments and reviews as per the *Customs Act 1901*; and
- if anti-dumping measures were imposed by the Minister, confirmation TBEA will not be eligible for an accelerated review in accordance with the Commission's position in Issues Paper 2014/01.
