



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2014/130

Power transformers

Exported from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia, the Republic of Korea, Taiwan, Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Termination of part of an investigation

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 29 July 2013, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of power transformers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia), the Republic of Korea (Korea), Taiwan, Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (Vietnam), following an application lodged by Wilson Transformer Company Pty Ltd.

The Commission published a notice in *The Australian* on that date notifying of the initiation of the investigation. Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2013/64 provides further details of the investigation and is available on the Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

As a result of the investigation, I, Dale Seymour, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, am satisfied that in relation to:

- ABB Chongqing Transformer Co., Ltd, ABB Zhongshan Transformer Co., Ltd, Changzhou Toshiba Transformer Co., Ltd, CHINT Electric Co., Ltd and Jiangsu Huapeng Transformer Co., Ltd, exporters of power transformers from China;
- PT. Unelec Indonesia (UNINDO), an exporter of power transformers from Indonesia; and
- Hyundai Heavy Industries Co., Ltd, an exporter of power transformers from Korea,

there has been no dumping by these exporters of power transformers the subject of the application. I have therefore terminated the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) so far as it relates to these exporters.

I am satisfied that in relation to China, the total volume of goods exported from China that have been, or may be, dumped is less than 3% of the total Australian import volume as prescribed in subsection 269TDA(4) of the Act. I have therefore

terminated the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(3) of the Act so far as it relates to China.

I am satisfied that in relation to Korea, the total volume of goods exported from Korea that have been, or may be, dumped is less than 3% of the total Australian import volume as prescribed in subsection 269TDA(4) of the Act. I have therefore terminated the investigation in accordance with subsection 269TDA(3) of the Act so far as it relates to Korea.

In making these decisions to terminate, I have had regard to the application for this investigation, data submitted by exporters, Statement of Essential Facts No. 219, submissions from interested parties, and other relevant information received throughout the course of the investigation.

Termination Report No. 219, which sets out reasons for the decisions to terminate, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decisions are based, has been placed on the Commission's public record, which may be examined at the Commission's office by contacting the case manager using the details provided below. Alternatively, the public record is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

A notice of the decisions to terminate was published in *The Australian* newspaper on 1 December 2014.

Effective 1 December 2014, dumping securities will no longer be required in relation to imports of power transformers from all exporters in China; from all exporters in Korea; and from UNINDO in Indonesia. Dumping securities already taken in relation to goods exported from China, Korea and from Indonesia by UNINDO will be cancelled. The Australian Customs and Border Protection Service will contact importers in the near future in relation to this process.

The applicant for measures may request review of the decisions to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of the public notice.

The investigation into the alleged dumping of the goods from Indonesia (other than goods exported by UNINDO), Taiwan, Thailand and Vietnam will continue. My final report and recommendations in relation to the Commission's investigation will be provided to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry on 2 December 2014.
