

## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2015/49**

## **Certain Preserved Mushrooms**

## **Exported from People's Republic of China**

## **Expiry of Anti-Dumping Measures**

I, Dale Seymour, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, in accordance with subsection 269ZHB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), advise that the anti-dumping measures on preserved mushrooms exported from People's Republic of China are due to expire on 13 January 2016.

The anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice, were initially imposed by public notice on 12 January 2006 by the then Minister for Justice and Customs following consideration of *Trade Measures Report No.99*.

Those persons as specified at paragraph 269ZHB(1)(b) of the Act are invited to apply for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures. The application must be in writing, be in an approved form, contain such information that the form requires and be signed in the manner indicated in the form.

A notice advising the expiry of these anti-dumping measures was published in *The Australian* newspaper on 30 April 2015. Applications must be lodged by 29 June 2015.

The application must provide evidence addressing whether there appear to be reasonable grounds for asserting that the expiration of the anti-dumping measures to which the application relates might lead, or might be likely to lead, to a continuation of, or a recurrence of, the material injury that the measures are intended to prevent.

If an application is received that complies with the prescribed requirements and I decide not to reject that application, I must publish a notice to advise of the proposed inquiry into whether continuation of the measures are justified. I must report to the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science within 155 days after the date of publication of the notice (or by such later date as the Parliamentary Secretary may allow in accordance with subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act).

If I do not receive an application for the continuation of the anti-dumping measures by 29 June 2015, the anti-dumping measures applying to preserved mushrooms exported from the China will expire on 13 January 2016. Therefore on and from 14 January 2016 anti-dumping measures would no longer apply.
