## Revocation of certain Ministerial Exemptions

## Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975 and Acts Interpretation Act 1901

- 3. Ministerial Exemption Instrument No. 4 of 2014 made by the Hon. Robert Charles Baldwin MP, the then Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, under subsections 8(7) and 10(8) of the Dumping Duty Act and commencing on 13 June 2013, in its entirety.
