



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE No 2023/018

Zinc coated (galvanised) steel

Exported from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea and Taiwan

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Continuation No 611

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 22 August 2022, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an inquiry into whether the continuation of anti-dumping measures in respect of zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea and Taiwan is justified.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No 2022/086. This ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The notice initiating this inquiry (initiation notice) advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record by **10 December 2022**.¹ The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Minister) in relation to this inquiry. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a final report on or before **24 January 2023**.

As advised in ADN No 2022/107, the Commissioner extended the due dates to publish the SEF and provide the final report to the to 20 March 2023 and 4 May 2023 respectively.

Due to the complexity of this inquiry and to allow for:

- the consolidation and finalisation of the SEF and
- the consideration of any submissions received for the final report to ensure a robust final report

I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, Deputy Commissioner, Investigations, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,³ extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record no later than **3 April 2023**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on or before **25 May 2023**.
