Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XVB

Wind Towers

Exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China

Findings in relation to an Accelerated Review No 602 of Anti-Dumping Measures

Public Notice under section 269ZG(3) of the *Customs Act 1901 (Cth)*

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed the accelerated review, which commenced on 11 March 2022, of the anti-dumping measure applying to certain wind towers exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China (China) by Penglai Dajin Offshore Heavy Industry Co., Ltd.

The Commissioner’s recommendations resulting from that review, reasons for the recommendations and material findings of fact and law in relation to the review are outlined in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No 602 (REP 602)*.

I, ED HUSIC, the Minister for Industry and Science, have considered REP 602 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of facts and law set out in REP 602.

Under section 269ZG(3) of the *Customs Act 1901 (Cth)* (the Act), I declare that, with effect from 11 March 2022, the Act and the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975 (Cth)* have effect as if the original dumping duty notice had applied to the applicant but the then Parliamentary Secretary had specified different variable factors relevant to the determination of duty.


The duty that has been determined is an amount worked out in accordance with the ad valorem duty method, as detailed in the table below.

Exporter	Effective rate of interim dumping duty	Duty method
Penglai Dajin Offshore Heavy Industry Co., Ltd	1.2%	ad valorem
