ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2023/035

Customs Act 1901 - Part XVB

Zinc coated (galvanised) steel

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea and Taiwan

Findings of Continuation Inquiry No 611

Notice under section 269ZHG(1) of the Customs Act 1901

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an inquiry, which commenced on 22 August 2022, into whether the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applying to zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), the Republic of Korea (Korea) and Taiwan is justified. The anti-dumping measures are in the form of a dumping duty notice for zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from China, Korea and Taiwan (collectively, the subject countries) and a countervailing duty notice for zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from China.¹

The Commissioner's recommendations resulting from the inquiry, reasons for the recommendations, and material findings of fact and law in relation to the inquiry are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No 611* (REP 611).

I, ED HUSIC, the Minister for Industry and Science, have considered REP 611 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all material findings of facts and law set out in REP 611.

Under section 269ZHG(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I **declare** that I have decided to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures:

- in the form of a dumping duty notice applying to zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from China, Korea and Taiwan, and
- in the form of a countervailing duty notice applying to zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from China.

¹ Shandong Guanzhou Dingxin Plate Technology Co. Ltd, Angang Steel Company Ltd, Yieh Phui (China) Technomaterial Co. Ltd, Jiangyin Zongcheng Steel Co Ltd, ANSC-TKS Galvanizing Co Ltd also known as TAGAL, and all exporters from Korea and Taiwan are not subject to the countervailing duty notice.

In accordance with section 269ZHG(4)(a)(i) of the Act, I **determine** that the dumping duty notice and the countervailing duty notice continue in force after 7 August 2023 (the specified expiry date).

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (www.adreviewpanel.gov.au), in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
