



## Continuation Inquiry No 626

### PVC Flat Electric Cables

### Exported from the People's Republic of China

### File note in relation to the goods that are subject to the continuation inquiry

The purpose of this file note is to clarify that Anti-Dumping Notice 2019/47 applies to exports of certain polyvinyl chloride (PVC) flat electric cables (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), **except** goods exported by Guilin International Wire & Cable Co. Ltd and its related party entities (Guilin).<sup>1</sup>

#### ***Effect on Continuation Inquiry No 626***

On 9 June 2023, the Acting Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission initiated Continuation Inquiry No 626 into whether the continuation of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice, in respect of the goods is justified.<sup>2</sup>

The anti-dumping measures were originally imposed by public notice on 14 May 2019 in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No 2019/47 and are due to expire on 14 May 2024. ADN 2019/47 set out rates of duty for certain exporters from China, namely:

- Guilin
- Nanyang Cable (Tianjin) Co. Ltd
- uncooperative and all other exporters.

On 3 September 2019, Electra Cables (Aust) Pty Ltd applied for judicial review of the Minister's decision to impose a dumping duty on the goods exported from China to Australia by Guilin.

On 13 February 2020, the Federal Court of Australia set aside ADN 2019/47, insofar as it applied to Guilin.

On 1 September 2022, the Minister for Industry and Science published ADN 2022/019, a separate notice which imposed anti-dumping measures on the goods exported to Australia by Guilin. These measures are due to expire on 1 September 2027.

Accordingly, the scope of Continuation Inquiry No 626 only covers the measures currently in effect under ADN 2019/47 and **does not extend** to goods exported from China by Guilin.
