### Continuation 626 – PVC Flat Electrical Cables exported from the People's Republic of China

#### I. Introduction

Prysmian Australia Pty Ltd (**Prysmian**) is a manufacturer of PVC flat electrical cables (**the goods**) in Australia. Prysmian was the applicant company that requested the Anti-Dumping continuation inquiry applicable to exports of the goods from China – refer ADN No. 2023/021.

Prysmian makes the following representation following the Anti-Dumping Commission's (**the Commission**) Australian industry verification.

#### II. Evidence of price undercutting

During the industry verification, Prysmian provided an example to the Commission of substantial Chinese export price undercutting in the Australian market. Specifically, Prysmian evidenced that [**confidential text deleted – price undercutting details**], at a price that appeared to be well-below what would be the estimated full cost to make and sell.

As discussed during verification, Prysmian can further substantiate this claim with reference to an alternative and higher Chinese price point that it believes is suitable for comparison to the [**confidential text deleted – price undercutting details**].

At Confidential Attachment 1, Prysmian provides the details of this price comparison. In summary:

Prysmian submits that the [**confidential text deleted – price undercutting details**] substantially undercuts the Australian industry, and that continued measures with revised variable factors are required to address the injurious impacts of this activity and others like it.
