# **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE No 2024/024**

## **Wind towers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China**

### **Cessation of a Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No 615**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XV B*

On 27 February 2023, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice<sup>1</sup> announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures applying to certain wind towers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (Review 615). The review was initiated following an application from Keppel Prince Engineering Pty Ltd (KPE).<sup>2</sup> The application sought an examination of whether the variable factors relevant to the taking of the measures have changed.

While Review 615 was in process, the Commissioner initiated Continuation Inquiry No 621<sup>3</sup> following a separate application from KPE.<sup>4</sup> Continuation Inquiry No 621 examined whether the measures should continue after the specified expiry day for the measures (16 April 2024). The Commissioner completed Continuation Inquiry No 621 recommending to the Minister in Report 621 that the measures be allowed to expire.<sup>5</sup>

On 14 March 2024, the Minister for Industry and Science accepted the Commissioner's recommendation and decided not to secure the continuation of the measures. As a result, the anti-dumping measures expired on 16 April 2024.<sup>6</sup>

As the measures have expired, I have ceased consideration of Review 615.
