



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2024/022

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Ammonium Nitrate exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China, the Kingdom of Sweden and the Kingdom of Thailand

Findings of the Continuation Inquiry No 629

Public Notice under subsection 269ZHG(1) of the Customs Act 1901

The Acting Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an inquiry into whether the continuation of the anti-dumping measures in the form of a dumping duty notice applying to ammonium nitrate exported to Australia from the People’s Republic of China (China), the Kingdom of Sweden (Sweden) and the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand) (the measures) is justified. The inquiry commenced on 22 June 2023.

The Commissioner’s recommendations from that inquiry, reasons for the recommendations, and material findings of fact and law in relation to the inquiry are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 629* (REP 629).

I, ED HUSIC, the Minister for Industry and Science, have considered Report 629 and have decided to accept the recommendation and reasons for the recommendation, including all the material findings of fact and law set out in REP 629.


Under section 269ZHG(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I **declare** that I have decided not to secure the continuation of the measures. The measures will expire on **3 June 2024**.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (www.adreviewpanel.gov.au), in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
