### **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2024/067**

# Consumer Pineapple Exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia

### **Termination of Investigation No 627**

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 4 August 2023, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner)<sup>1</sup>, initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of consumer pineapple (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia). This followed the consideration of an application lodged by Golden Circle Limited (the applicant) under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of the Commissioner's decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (commission) website on 4 August 2023. As a result of the commission's investigation, I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, Acting Commissioner:

- am satisfied that, in relation to PT Great Giant Pineapple (GGP), some of the goods exported have been dumped, but the dumping margin is less than two per cent and, therefore, have terminated the investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(1)(b)(ii) of the Act so far as it relates to the exporter, and
- am satisfied that the total volume of goods that have been exported to Australia over a reasonable examination period from Indonesia that have been dumped is negligible and, therefore, have terminated the investigation so far as it relates to Indonesia in accordance with section 269TDA(3)(b) of the Act.

This terminates the investigation in its entirety with respect to exports of the goods by GGP and from Indonesia.

In making the decisions to terminate, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, verification reports, and other relevant information.
