



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE No 2024/074

Review of Measures No 640 in relation to Aluminium Extrusions

Exported from Malaysia

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and Final Report

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

The Acting¹ Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has extended the due date to publish the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) and provide the final report and recommendation to the Minister about the above case.²

New milestone dates

SEF – The SEF is now due to be placed on the public record on, or before, **18 December 2024**.

Response to SEF – Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF before **22 January 2025**. Noting the public holidays over the Christmas and New Year period, the Commissioner is providing additional time for interested parties to make submissions to the SEF to account for the reduced business activity period.³

Final Report – A recommendation to the Minister will be made in a final report which is now due on, or before, **3 March 2025**.

¹ References in this document to individuals holding positions within the Anti-Dumping Commission are references to whoever occupies the position at the time. This includes when the position is held in an acting capacity.

² They do so under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act). On 19 January 2017, the Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science delegated the powers and functions of the Minister under section 269ZHI of the Act to the Commissioner. See Anti-Dumping Notice 2017/10 for further information.

³Section 269ZDA(3)(iv) of the Act requires the Commissioner to have regard to any submissions received in response to the SEF within 20 days of that statement being placed on public record, and such submissions will be taken into account in completing the report and recommendation to the Minister. In this case, 20 days after publication of the SEF on 18 December 2024 will be 7 January 2025. The Commissioner is therefore providing an additional 15 days for interested parties to make submissions.

PUBLIC RECORD

The previous due date for the SEF was 4 October 2024. The previous due date for the final report was 6 December 2024.

Basis for extension

I, Justin Wickes, am the Acting Deputy Commissioner Investigations, Anti-Dumping Commission (the commission). I requested the extension of the due date to publish the SEF and to provide the final report and recommendation to the Minister.

I requested the extension because there have been delays completing verification of relevant data and because it was necessary in the circumstances of the case.
