**Investigation No. 628 – Pineapple fruit, FSI from Thailand – Response to Statement of Essential Facts**

We refer to the above investigation (**Investigation**) and the Statement of Essential Facts published by the Anti-Dumping Commission on 21 November 2024 (**SEF**).

We provide the below response to the SEF on behalf of our client, Dole Thailand Limited (**DTL**).

The SEF (relevantly) notes that:

- the Anti-Dumping Commission (**Commission**) has calculated DTL's dumping margin for the good exported to Australia during the investigation period to be negative 2.7%;
- the Anti-Dumping Commissioner (**Commissioner**) has found that there was negligible dumping by DTL during the investigation period; and
- the Commissioner proposes to terminate the Investigation with respect to DTL pursuant to section 269TDA(1) of the *Customs Act 1901*.

We advise that DTL accepts the above calculation and finding and is supportive of the proposed termination of the Investigation with respect to DTL.

DTL thanks the Commission for the opportunity to participate in the Investigation.
