



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2024/096

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

Deep drawn stainless steel sinks

Exported from the People’s Republic of China

Findings of the Continuation Inquiry into Anti-Dumping Measures No 646

Public Notice under section 269ZHG(1) of the Customs Act 1901

The Acting Commissioner¹ of the Anti-Dumping Commission has completed an inquiry, which commenced on 6 May 2024, into whether the continuation of the anti-dumping measures in the form of a dumping and countervailing duty notice applying to deep drawn stainless steel sinks (the goods) exported to Australia from the Peoples’s Republic of China (China) are justified.

Recommendations resulting from that inquiry, reasons for the recommendations, and material findings of fact and law in relation to the inquiry are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No. 646* (Report 646).

I, ED HUSIC, the Minister for Industry and Science, have considered REP 646 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all the material findings of fact and law therein.

Under section 269ZHG(1)(a) of the Customs Act 1901 (the Act), I, **declare** that I have decided not to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures currently applying to deep drawn stainless steel sinks exported to Australia from China. These measures will expire on 26 March 2025.

On and from 27 March 2025, the measures in the form of a countervailing duty notice no longer apply.

The measures in the form of a dumping duty notice were revoked with my decision following Review of Measures No 652 (Review 652).²

¹ References in this document to individuals holding positions within the Anti-Dumping Commission (commission) are references to whoever occupies the position at the time. This includes when the position is held in an acting capacity.


² My decision with respect to Review 652 revoked the dumping duty notice as it related to all exporters from China generally with effect on and from 25 June 2024. Anti-Dumping Notice No. 2024/097 refers.
