ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2025/002

Food Service and Industrial (FSI) Pineapple Exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia and the Kingdom of Thailand

Termination of part of Investigation No 628

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 4 August 2023, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner)¹, initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping of FSI pineapple (the goods) exported to Australia from the Republic of Indonesia (Indonesia) and the Kingdom of Thailand (Thailand). This followed the consideration of an application lodged by Golden Circle Limited (the applicant) under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of the Commissioner's decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation (initiation notice) was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (commission) website on 4 August 2023.²

As a result of the commission's investigation, I Isolde Lueckenhausen, Acting Commissioner, am satisfied that:

- in relation to Dole Thailand Limited (DTL) and Prime Products Co Ltd (PPI) from Thailand, that some of the goods exported have been dumped, but the dumping margin is less than two per cent and, therefore, have terminated the investigation so far as it relates to these two exporters in accordance with section 269TDA(1)(b)(ii) of the Act, and
- in relation to the goods that have been, or may be, exported to Australia from Thailand, that the injury, if any, to an Australian industry, that has been, or may be, caused by that export is negligible and, therefore, have terminated the investigation so far as it relates to Thailand in accordance with section 269TDA(13) of the Act.

This terminates the investigation with respect to exports of the goods by DTL, PPI and Thailand.

On 5 September 2024, I published a separate *Termination Report 628*³ and notice⁴ that explained my reasons for terminating part of the investigation in relation to exports of the goods from PT Great Giant Pineapple and Indonesia.

This notice brings Investigation No 628 to an end.

In making the decisions to terminate the investigation for DTL, PPI and Thailand, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, verification reports, and other relevant information.

Termination Report No 628A sets out reasons for the termination decisions, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decisions are based.⁵

The applicant may request a review of these decisions to terminate the investigation for DTL, PPI and Thailand by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
