ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2026/041

Hot rolled coil steel

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Termination of part of Investigation No 658

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 15 November 2024, the then Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of hot rolled coil steel (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) following an application lodged by BlueScope Steel Ltd (BlueScope) under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of the then Commissioner's decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (commission) website on 15 November 2024 in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2024/093. ADN 2024/093 is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

As a result of the commission's investigation, I, David Latina, am satisfied that countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of some or all of the goods, but the subsidy level never, at any time during the investigation period, exceeded the negligible level of countervailable subsidy under section 269TDA(16), in relation to these exporters:

- Baoshan Iron & Steel Co Ltd
- Baosteel Zhanjiang Iron & Steel Co Ltd
- Shanghai Meishan Iron & Steel Co Ltd
- Hunan Valin Lianyuan Iron & Steel Co Ltd

Accordingly, I have terminated the subsidy investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(2) of the Act so far as it relates to these exporters.

In making the decision to terminate, I have had regard to *Statement of Essential Facts No 658* (SEF 658), submissions in response to SEF 658, and other relevant information.

Termination Report No 658, which sets out reasons for the termination decision, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decision is based, has been placed on the Commission's public record at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The subsidy investigation in relation to 'all other exporters' and the dumping investigation for all exporters are still ongoing. I am due to report to the Minister for Industry and Innovation and the Minister for Science (the Minister), in respect of this investigation on or by 10 April 2026.

The applicant may request a review of this decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
