

# IRONSIDE

Dear Commissioners,

We are writing on behalf of Ironside Construction, an Australian builder, to express our concerns regarding the current anti-dumping investigation involving imported Aluminum windows and doors.

We understand that this investigation has been initiated primarily by companies operating in the residential house sector.

We would like to highlight that Broad Windows, the supplier in question, predominantly serves the residential apartment and commercial building markets, particularly focusing on multi-level to high-rise projects.

These projects differ significantly from residential houses in terms of design requirements, engineering standards, and supply chain dynamics.

Imposing such measures on suppliers like Broad Windows would severely disrupt the efficiency and cost structure of window and door procurement for builders like Ironside Construction, who rely on timely and competitively priced inputs to deliver large-scale projects within budget and schedule. Any increase in cost or delay in supply resulting from anti-dumping duties would not only impact builders but also affect housing affordability, project viability and employment in the sector.

We recommend that the Commission to consider this distinction and exempt Class 2 builders (typically involved in multi-residential and commercial constructions) from any measures.
