



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2026/060

Zinc coated (galvanised) steel Exported from the Socialist Republic of Vietnam China Steel and Nippon Steel Vietnam Joint Stock Company Findings of corporate restructure (CR) 001

I, David Latina, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner), have concluded the corporate restructure assessment as to whether China Steel and Nippon Steel Vietnam Joint Stock Company (CSVC) from the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (Vietnam) is effectively the same entity as an exporter previously examined and currently listed in the Dumping Commodity Register (DCR) exporter table.¹

For the reasons set out below, I am SATISFIED that China Steel and Nippon Steel Vietnam Joint Stock Company is the same entity as the previously examined exporter China Steel Sumikin Vietnam Joint Stock Company. The effect of this finding is that China Steel and Nippon Steel Vietnam Joint Stock Company will replace China Steel Sumikin Vietnam Joint Stock Company in the DCR.

The information I considered as part of this assessment is outlined in Appendix A below.

Future exports of zinc coated (galvanised) steel exported to Australia from Vietnam by China Steel and Nippon Steel Vietnam Joint Stock Company will be subject to the anti-dumping measures relevant to exports of those goods by China Steel Sumikin Vietnam Joint Stock Company. This change will take effect at the date of publication of this notice.

Background

On 10 April 2026, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the commission) published Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No 2026/040. This notice advised interested parties that the commission had received an assessment form by CSVC from Vietnam to examine whether CSVC is effectively the same entity as an exporter previously examined and currently listed in the DCR exporter table.

Appendix A – Outline of Assessment

In ADN No 2026/040, the commission noted that CSVC provided information seeking to confirm its status as the previously examined exporter China Steel Sumikin Vietnam Joint Stock Company and invited submissions from interested parties.

The commission received one submission from BlueScope Steel Limited on 28 April 2026. This submission raised the following points:

- whether documentation (Australian Border Force (ABF) entries, bills of lading etc) substantiate that imports from CSVC since 2019 are under the new name
- whether imports from CSVC since the name change (in August 2019) were correctly declared under the relevant dumping specification number (DSN)
- the reason for the delay in CSVC seeking this change be made to the DCR, noting the name change was made in August 2019.

The commission has assessed the information contained in the assessment form and considered the submission noted above.²

The commission has found:

- There is effectively no change in major shareholders following the name change.
- CSVC continues to perform the same functions relating to the manufacturing and/or exporting of the goods as China Steel Sumikin Vietnam Joint Stock Company did prior to the company's name change.
- CSVC operates the same production facilities as China Steel Sumikin Vietnam Joint Stock Company.
- The production and distribution of the goods do not appear to have been altered as a result of the name change.
- In continuation inquiry 592, the commission received a response to the exporter questionnaire (REQ) from CSVC, identifying the new name of the entity.³
- Based on the information provided in the REQ in continuation inquiry 592, documentation substantiating domestic sales identify CSVC as the entity (i.e. confirming the name change has occurred).
- Analysis of ABF data for a contemporaneous period (from January 2024 onwards) indicates that exports to Australia have correctly been reported under DSN 126, the DSN relevant to "all other exporters".

The commission notes BlueScope's query regarding the reason for the delay in requesting this change. The applicant indicated that they became aware of the need to update the DCR while considering the next continuation inquiry relating to the measures on zinc coated (galvanised) steel from Vietnam, with measures due to expire in August 2027.
