



Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

Interchangeable bolted clipping system brackets - 644

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Notice pursuant to sections 8(5) and 8(5B) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

I, TIM AYRES, Minister for Industry and Innovation and Minister for Science, have decided to issue a notice (the notice)¹ pursuant to sections 269TG(1) and 269TG(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of certain interchangeable bolted clipping system brackets (the goods described in that notice) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

I DETERMINE, pursuant to section 8(5) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act), that the interim dumping duty (IDD) payable on the goods is an amount worked out in accordance with the *ad valorem* duty method, specified in regulation 5(7) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Regulation 2013*.

Pursuant to section 8(5B) of the Dumping Duty Act, I have had regard to the desirability of specifying a method such that the sum of:

- (i) the export price of goods of that kind as so ascertained or last ascertained; and
- (ii) the IDD payable on the goods the subject of the notice,

does not exceed the non-injurious price of goods of that kind as ascertained, or last ascertained, for the purpose of the notice.

As the non-injurious price is less than the normal value for all exporters, I have specified a method such that the sum of the ascertained exported price of the goods and the IDD payable on those goods does not exceed the non-injurious price.

This notice applies to the goods and like goods entered for home consumption as per my declaration in ADN No 2026/056 under section 269TG of the Act and to which section 8 of the Dumping Duty Act applies.
