ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2026/108

Light gauge steel stud and track

Exported from the People's Republic of China

**Termination of Subsidy Investigation for Wenan Kaize
Building Material Co., Ltd**

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 30 June 2025, the Anti-Dumping Commission (the commission) initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of light gauge steel stud and track (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China), following an application made by Rondo Building Services Pty Limited (Rondo, the applicant) under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (Cth) (the Act).

Public notice of the decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the commission's website on 30 June 2025.¹

As a result of the commission's investigation, I, David Latina, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, am satisfied that, in relation to Wenan Kaize Building Material Co., Ltd (Kaize), countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of some or all of the goods exported by Kaize, but the subsidies never, at any time during the investigation period, exceeded the negligible level of countervailable subsidy under section 269TDA(16) and therefore, I have terminated the subsidy investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(2) of the Act in so far as it relates to Kaize.

In making the decision to terminate the investigation relating to the application for a countervailing duty notice for Kaize, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties, *Statement of Essential Facts No 679* (SEF 679), submissions in response to that SEF, and other relevant information.

Termination Report No 679, which sets out reasons for the termination decision, including the material findings of fact and law upon which the decision is based, has been placed on the commission's public record at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The investigation relating to the application for publication of a dumping duty notice and alleged dumping in respect of all exporters from China and the application for a publication of a countervailing duty notice and alleged subsidisation of the goods in respect of *uncooperative and all other exporters* from China will continue. I am due to report to the Minister in respect of this investigation by 17 August 2026.
