ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2026/102

Certain Flat Rolled Steel Products

Exported from the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Korea

Termination of part of Investigation No 688

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

On 24 October 2025, I, David Latina, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission, initiated an investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of certain flat rolled steel products (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) and the Republic of Korea (Korea), following an application lodged by BlueScope Steel Limited (BlueScope) under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act).

Public notice of my decision to not reject the application and to initiate the investigation was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website on 24 October 2025. The ADN is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

As a result of the Commission's investigation, I:

- am satisfied that, in relation to POSCO from Korea, there has been no dumping by the exporter of any of those goods the subject of the application and, therefore, I have terminated the investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(1) of the Act so far as it relates to POSCO.
- am satisfied that, in relation to Baosteel Zhanjiang Iron & Steel Co., Ltd (Baosteel Zhanjiang) and Hunan Valin Lianyuan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd (Hunan Valin) from China, countervailable subsidies have been received in respect of some or all of the goods, but the subsidy never, at any time during the investigation period, exceeded the negligible level of countervailable subsidy under section 269TDA(16) and, therefore, I have terminated the investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(2) of the Act in so far as it relates to the Baosteel Zhanjiang and Hunan Valin.

In making the decisions to terminate, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties concerning the publication of ADN 2025/111, *Statement of Essential Facts No. 688* (SEF 688), submissions in response to SEF 688, and other relevant information.

Termination Report No. 688, which sets out reasons for the termination decisions, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decisions are based, has been placed on the Commission's public record at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The investigation into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of the goods from China and alleged dumping from Korea will continue. I am due to report to the Minister for Industry and Innovation and the Minister for Science (the Minister) in respect of this investigation on or before 26 August 2026.

The applicant may request a review of this decision to terminate the investigation by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel in the approved form and manner within 30 days of the publication of this notice.
