Findings in Relation to a Dumping Investigation

Termination of part of Investigation No 690

Public notice under section 269TDA(15) of the Customs Act 1901

Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2026/117

On 23 October 2025, I, David Latina, Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (**Commissioner**) initiated an investigation (**the investigation**) into the alleged dumping and subsidisation of freight railway wheels (**the goods**) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (**China**), following an application made by Commonwealth Steel Company Pty Ltd (**Comsteel**) under section 269TB(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (**the Act**).¹

Further details in relation to the initiation of the investigation and a full description of the goods can be found in ADN 2025/110.²

As a result of the investigation, I, David Latina, the Commissioner, am satisfied that, in relation to Baowu Group Masteel Rail Transit Materials Technology Company Ltd (**Masteel**), there has been no dumping of the goods during the investigation period (1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025). I have therefore terminated part of the dumping investigation in accordance with section 269TDA(1)(b)(i) of the Act as it relates to Masteel.

In making the decision to terminate part of the investigation, I have had regard to the application, submissions from interested parties concerning the publication of ADN 2025/110, Statement of Essential Facts (**SEF**) No 690 and submissions in response to that SEF.

Termination Report No 690, which sets out reasons for the termination decision, including the material findings of fact or law upon which the decisions are based, is available at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The remaining investigation, i.e. the dumping investigation for exporters other than Masteel and the subsidy investigation for all exporters including Masteel, will be addressed in my report to the Minister for Industry and Innovation and Minister for Science pursuant to section 269TEA(1), due by 14 August 2026.
