



Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

Light gauge steel stud and track

Exported to Australia from The People's Republic of China

Notice pursuant to sections 10(3B) and 10(3D) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

I, TIM AYRES, the Minister for Industry and Innovation and Minister for Science, having decided to issue a notice pursuant to section 269TJ(1) and section 269TJ(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of light gauge steel stud and track in that notice (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, DIRECT, pursuant to section 10(3B) of the *Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975* (the Dumping Duty Act), that the interim countervailing duty referred to in section 10(3A) of that Act in respect of the goods be ascertained as a proportion of the export price of those particular goods.

Pursuant to section 10(3D) of the Dumping Duty Act, I have had regard to the desirability of fixing the amount of interim countervailing duty such that the sum of:

- (i) the export price of goods of that kind, as ascertained, or last ascertained; and
- (ii) that amount of the interim countervailing duty as so fixed; and
- (iii) the amount of interim dumping duty as fixed under section 8 of the Dumping Duty Act on goods the subject of the notice under section 269TG of the Act

does not exceed the non-injurious price of goods of that kind as ascertained, or last ascertained, for the purposes of those notices.

This notice applies to the goods and like goods entered for home consumption as per my declaration in the countervailing duty notice.¹
