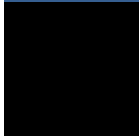

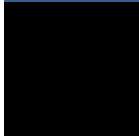

Tariff Classification

The goods the subject of anti-dumping measures are typically classified to the following harmonized tariff sub-headings:

- 7210.49.00 (statistical codes 55, 56, 57, 58);
- 7212.30.00 (statistical code 61);
- 7225.92.00 (statistical code 38); and
- 7226.99.00 (statistical code 71).

Countries/companies the subject of the measures

The current anti-dumping measures, in the form of the below referenced Dumping Duty Notices (**the Notices**), apply to galvanised exported to Australia from India, Malaysia and Vietnam.

BlueScope seeks a continuation of the Notice as it applies to all exporters of the goods exported to Australia from the subject countries.

Date of publication of the measures

The relevant Notice is as follows:

- ADN 2017/99, published 16 August 2017.

BlueScope proposes an inquiry period for the continuation investigation of July 2025 – June 2026 (FY2026). While recognised it is common for the Anti-Dumping Commission to request an additional quarter of Australian industry data than what was provided in an application, this would impose a significant delay to the proposed inquiry.

BlueScope estimates that preparing, reconciling, and reviewing an additional quarter would take approximately 6-8 weeks, given the need to extract information across multiple of BlueScope's systems and prepare supporting exhibits. Such delay would materially defer the Commission's ability to assess whether the expiration of the measures on galvanised steel from the subject countries will likely lead to a continuation and recurrence of dumping and consequent material injury that the measures are intended to prevent.

Provision of data

Industry financial data must, wherever possible, be submitted in an electronic format.
