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APPLICATION UNDER SECTION 269ZE OF THE CUSTOMS ACT 1901 FOR AN ACCELERATED REVIEW OF ANTI-DUMPING MEASURES

In accordance with section 269ZE of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) ¹, I request that the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission conduct an accelerated review of a dumping duty notice and/or countervailing duty notice (the notice(s)) insofar as it affects this exporter².

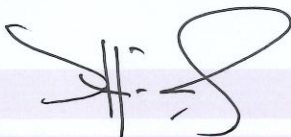
NB: Only a new exporter is eligible to apply for an accelerated review. A new exporter means that, in relation to goods the subject of an application for a dumping duty notice or countervailing duty notice or like goods, an exporter who did not export such goods to Australia at any time during the investigation period in relation to the application (ss 269ZE(1) and 269T(1) refers).

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Signature requirements

Where the application is made:

By a company - the application must be signed by a director, servant or agent acting with the authority of the corporate body.

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Required information

1. Provide details of the current anti-dumping measure(s) the subject of this review application, including:

- (a) identify the notice(s) imposing measures that the applicant seeks an accelerated review of; and

Answer:

This application seeks an accelerated review pursuant to section 269ZE of the Customs Act 1901 of the current anti-dumping measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions exported from Malaysia to Australia, insofar as those measures apply to JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN.BHD.

Based on the current Dumping Commodity Register – Aluminium Extrusions published by the Anti-Dumping Commission, the applicant understands that anti-dumping measures applying generally to aluminium extrusions exported from Malaysia were reinstated with effect from 22 May 2026 following an Anti-Dumping Review Panel review (ADRP Notice dated 22 May 2026). The DCR records this Malaysia measure as an interim dumping duty (“IDD”) measure with an expiry date of 22 May 2031.

Under the current measure, Malaysian exporters not otherwise individually identified are classified as “All other exporters” under Dumping Specification Number (DSN) 318, with a published effective rate of duty of 27.0%.

JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN. BHD. is not presently a named exporter with an individually determined DSN or duty rate. Accordingly, this application seeks an accelerated review of the measure applying to “All other exporters” from Malaysia, so that the applicable dumping duty, if any, may be determined on the basis of the applicant’s own verified data and individual commercial circumstances.

The applicant also notes that separate measures currently apply to certain named Malaysian exporters in respect of mill-finish aluminium extrusions under Anti-Dumping Notice 2026/050 and surface-finish aluminium extrusions under Anti-Dumping Notice 2026/051. JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN.BHD. is not one of the exporters named under those measures. The DCR records those measures separately from the Malaysia measure reinstated on 22 May 2026.

For the avoidance of doubt, the goods description relied upon for the purpose of this application is the goods description contained in REP 591.

- (b) a description of the goods to which the notice(s) relates.

Answer:

The goods for which the accelerated review is sought are:

Aluminium extrusions produced via an extrusion process, of alloys having metallic elements falling within the alloy designations published by The Aluminium Association commencing with 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7 (or proprietary or other certifying-body equivalents), with the finish being as extruded (mill), mechanical, anodised or painted or otherwise coated, whether or not worked, having a wall thickness or diameter greater than 0.5 mm, with a

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maximum weight per metre of 27 kilograms and a profile or cross-section which fits within a circle having a diameter of 421 mm.

The goods under consideration include aluminium extrusion products that have been further processed or fabricated to a limited extent, after aluminium has been extruded through a die. For example, aluminium extrusion products that have been painted, anodised, or otherwise coated, or worked (e.g. precision cut, machined, punched or drilled) fall within the scope of goods.

The goods do not extend to intermediate or finished products that are processed or fabricated to such an extent that they no longer possess the nature and physical characteristics of an aluminium extrusion, but have become a different product.

4. Describe the applicant's role in the exportation of the goods (e.g. producer or manufacturer, distributor or trader of the goods);

Answer:

JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN. BHD. is a Malaysian manufacturer and producer of aluminium extrusion products. The company manufactures aluminium extrusion profiles from aluminium billets for supply to domestic

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and overseas markets.

5. Confirm that the applicant is a 'new exporter', meaning, in relation to goods the subject of an application for a dumping duty notice or countervailing duty notice or like goods, an exporter who did not export such goods to Australia at any time during the investigation period in relation to the application (ss 269ZE(1) and 269T(1) refers).

Answer:

The applicant confirms that:

- *did not export the subject goods or like goods, to Australia during the investigation period relevant to the measures; and*
- *it has not previously exported aluminium extrusion products to Australia.*

A director's declaration confirming the absence of exports to Australia during the relevant investigation period and since incorporation is attached to the confidential version of the application.

6. Confirm whether the applicant has previously applied for an accelerated review in relation to the notices the subject of this application.

Answer:

The applicant confirms that it has not previously applied for an accelerated review in relation to the relevant anti-dumping notice(s).

7. Confirm whether the applicant is related to an exporter whose exports were examined in relation to the application for publication of the notice(s), and the nature of the relationship (s 269ZE(2)(b) refers).

In determining whether the applicant is an associate of an exporter whose exports were examined in relation to the application for publication of the notices(s), answer the following (s 269TAA(4) refers):

- (a) Are both natural persons?

If yes:

- (i) Are they members of the same family? Or;
- (ii) Is one of them an officer or director of a body corporate controlled, directly or indirectly, by the other?

- (b) Are both body corporates?

- (c) Is one of them, being a body corporate, directly or indirectly, controlled by the other (whether or not a body corporate)?

- (d) Is one of them, being a natural person, an employee, officer or director of the other (whether or not a body corporate)?

- (e) Are they members of the same partnership?

Answer:

JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN. BHD. confirms that it is not related to any Malaysian producer or exporter of aluminium extrusions whose exports were examined during the original anti-dumping investigation that resulted in the publication of the relevant dumping duty notice.

The company is independently owned and operated and is not controlled by, nor does it control, any previously examined exporter.

Detail ownership and corporate structure information is provided in the confidential version of the application.

8. Provide a statement setting out the basis on which you consider the particular dumping or countervailing duty notice is inappropriate, so far as the applicant is concerned.

Answer:

The applicant respectfully submits that the current anti-dumping measures applicable to "All other exporters" from Malaysia under DSN 318, with a published effective rate of duty of 27.0%, should not automatically apply to JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN.BHD. because:

- *The company was not part of the original investigation;*
- *It has no historical exports to Australia;*
- *It operates a genuine manufacturing business with established export activities in overseas and regional markets; and*
- *Its pricing and commercial practices should be assessed based on the company's own verified information and individual circumstances.*

The applicant further submits that its proposed exports are at an initial market-entry stage and should be assessed on their own merits as part of the accelerated review process.

The applicant understands that measures applying to certain aluminium extrusions exported from Malaysia have included countervailing duty measures in addition to anti-dumping measures. JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN. BHD. confirms that it did not receive any export-contingent subsidy, export grant, preferential export financing arrangement or other specific government assistance that was the subject of the original countervailing investigation during the relevant original investigation period.

The applicant is committed to full cooperation with the Anti-Dumping Commission and is prepared to provide such additional information and supporting documentation as may be requested during the accelerated review process.

For these reasons, the applicant respectfully requests that the Commissioner conduct an accelerated review and determine and individual assessment applicable specifically to JS ALUMINIUM EXTRUDER SDN. BHD. based on its own verified data and commercial

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circumstances.

Impact of an all exporter review of measures

This means that changes to a notice as an outcome of an all-exporter review of measures may replace an earlier published outcome of an accelerated review.
