Investigation 384

The alleged dumping of alloy round bar exported from the People's Republic of China (China)

5 April 2017

The Anti-Dumping Commission met with representatives of Donhad on 5 April 2017. The purpose of the meeting was to gather further information and evidence regarding Donhad's submission in investigation 384.¹ Donhad provided the Commission with confidential attachments, where possible, in support of its claims. The points discussed have been outlined below:

1. Donhad provided an overview of their business operations for grinding media.
2. Donhad provided their views on the composition of the Australian industry, and reiterated their views contained in their submission. This includes the need for Molycop to be included in the investigation.
3. Donhad gave a presentation to the Commission on the technical specifications of alloy round bar for use in grinding media. They explained certain specifications of grinding media that are required by their customers. Donhad provided confidential data with regards to the technical specifications.
4. Donhad presented their views on the Australian market structure.
5. Donhad described the supply arrangements it has with its steel suppliers. They explained the effects the different supply arrangements have on its business operations. As an example, Donhad explained how the value

propositions offered by one supplier placed undue risk on Donhad and were a factor in Donhad sourcing supply from elsewhere.

6. Donhad discussed the claims made by OneSteel about injury and causation. Confidential information was provided regarding supply arrangements and technical specifications.
