



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/07

Alloy Round Steel Bar

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue Final Report in relation to an investigation

Customs Act 1901 – Part XV B

On 10 January 2017, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of alloy round steel bar (the goods) exported from the People's Republic of China (China).

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2017/02 (initiation notice), available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The statement of essential facts (SEF) for the investigation was placed on the public record on 27 October 2017.¹ The due date for submissions in response to the SEF was 16 November 2017. The Commission extended the due date for submissions in response to the SEF to 24 November 2017 following requests from interested parties.

The Commission received a number of submissions in response to the SEF that raised complex issues requiring further consideration. As a result, and in order to finalise this process I, Geoff Gleeson, Acting General Manager, Investigations, requested a further extension of time under subsection 269ZHI(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Parliamentary Secretary.²

¹ The SEF was originally due to be placed on the public record on 30 April 2017. During the course of the investigation the due date for the SEF was extended on four occasions. ADN No. 2017/60 confirmed that the due date for the SEF had been extended to 19 June 2017 (the first extension of time). ADN No. 2017/80 confirmed that the due date for the SEF had been extended to 19 July 2017 (the second extension of time). ADN No. 2017/104 confirmed that the due date for the SEF had been extended to 17 September 2014 (the third extension of time). ADN No. 2017/130 confirmed that the due date for the SEF had been extended to 27 October 2017 (the fourth extension of time).

² On 15 December 2016, the Commissioner delegated his powers and functions under section 269ZHI of the Act to the General Managers of the Anti-Dumping Commission. See [ADN 2017/10](http://www.adcommission.gov.au) for further information.

The Commissioner, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act,³ has again extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendations. The Commissioner's recommendation will now be made in a report due on or before 25 January 2018, unless this investigation is terminated earlier.⁴
