



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2018/194

Steel rod in coil Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China Extension of time granted to issue Final Report in relation a Review of Anti-Dumping Measures

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 3 April 2018, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of Anti-Dumping measures applying to steel rod in coil (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.¹ The review is to examine whether the variable factors relevant to the taking of the anti-dumping measures as they affect all the exporters of the goods from China should be varied.

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2018/56 (initiation notice), available on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) was placed on the public record on 19 November 2018. The SEF outlined that a recommendation to the Minister for Industry, Science and Technology would be made in a final report on or before 3 January 2019.

In order to fully consider the matters raised in the submission to the SEF prior to finalisation of the final report, I, Paul Sexton, General Manager, Investigations, requested an extension of time under subsection 269ZHI(1)(e) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) to the deadline for the Commissioner to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under subsection 269ZHI(3) of the Act,³ extended the deadline to provide his final report and recommendations. The Commissioner's recommendation will now be made in a report due on or before 18 January 2019.
